

### Pruning Circular Again Available

"Pruning the Apple Tree," a 12-page circular which has been out of print for some time, is now available again to North Carolina farmers and fruit growers. A reprint of the publication has just been issued, and copies may be obtained by writing the Agricultural Editor, State College Station, Raleigh.

Designated as Extension Circular 205, the publication was prepared by H. R. Niswonger, in charge of horticultural extension work at State College. It discusses the object of pruning and

gives in detail the methods to be followed in pruning both young and old apple trees. Fourteen illustrations are used to emphasize correct and incorrect methods of pruning.

"Pruning of young and bearing apple trees," says Niswonger "is an essential practice of orchard management. It is desirable to prune young trees in order to secure a mechanically strong framework capable of supporting large crops of fruit with the least breakage of branches. Pruning influences the size and age at which young trees bear fruit and the amount of pruning necessary in later years."

"The pruning of bearing and mature trees," Niswonger continues, "permits better penetration of spray materials, admits sunlight and free circulation of air. It stimulates new growth, influences the quality and quantity of the fruit and facilitates thinning and picking operations. Pruning is necessary in order to remove dead and diseased branches, thereby safeguarding the health of the remaining portions of the tree."

### Youths To Compete In Garden Contest

North Carolina boys and girls will have an opportunity again this year to compete in the annual production-marketing contest of the National Junior Vegetable Growers Association, according to H. M. Compton, horticulturist for the State College Extension Service.

A total of \$6,000 in cash prizes and agricultural scholarships will be awarded to some 200 state, sectional, regional, and national winners. The funds are being provided by the Great Atlantic and Pacific Tea Company, and every boy and girl in the United States who has an interest in growing vegetables is eligible to compete.

The top award of \$500 will go to the individual chosen the country's National Junior Vegetable Growing Champion. Top regional prizes of \$200 each will be awarded to winners in each of the four regions, northeast, central, and west. Thirty-three sectional prizes of \$100 each will be distributed, plus state awards in each participating state.

The program is divided into two phases. First, a production project is required, and the garden that is planned for 4-H Club or FFA work may be used. It involves a careful plan of work plus records of cost, production, income, and how and where various operations were carried out.

Second, a marketing study course is provided. This will supply each individual with knowledge of the best production areas, conditions that control quality in

vegetables, and the various grades and packages used in selling crops, as well as various types of wholesale and retail outlets.
