MIRACLE BOYS

Traphill high school boys basketball team is one of the most unusual sports organizations in western North Carolina...

Traphill is the smallest of the county high schools in Wilkes. The students enrollment is smallest, and it has the smallest plant of any schools which participate in inter-scholastic basketball.

Of more effect on the sports program is the fact that Traphill has no gymnasium and the only home practice has been on dirt courts...

Yet this small group of boys this year amassed an enviable record and with possibly one exception defeated all boys teams in the county at least once.

This team went to the Yadkin Valley tournament at Elkin and were eliminated on a bad night after winning one game. That was a blow to the boys from Traphill because they had their minds set on winning that four-county tournament.

By no means dismayed, the Traphill boys entered the Journal-Sentinel northwest tournament in Winston-Salem, reputed to be the world's largest. Their first opponents were Yadkinville boys, Yadkin valley four-county champions and rated highly in the northwest cage meet.

The very next night, Traphill was pitted against Elkin, which has one of the better boys teams in this part of the state...

Much credit for the Traphill success goes to Eldred Billings, center on the team and who handled the team on the court.

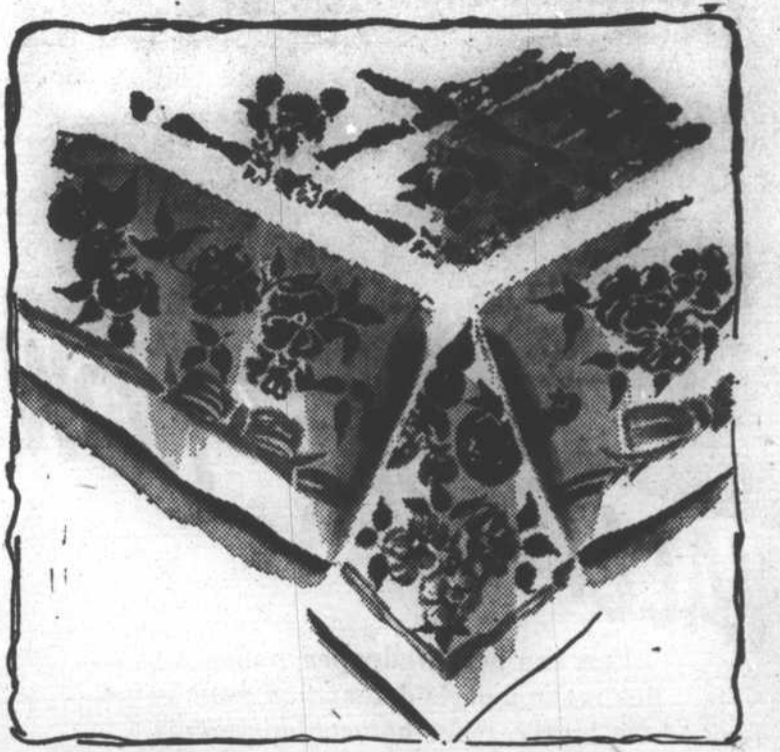

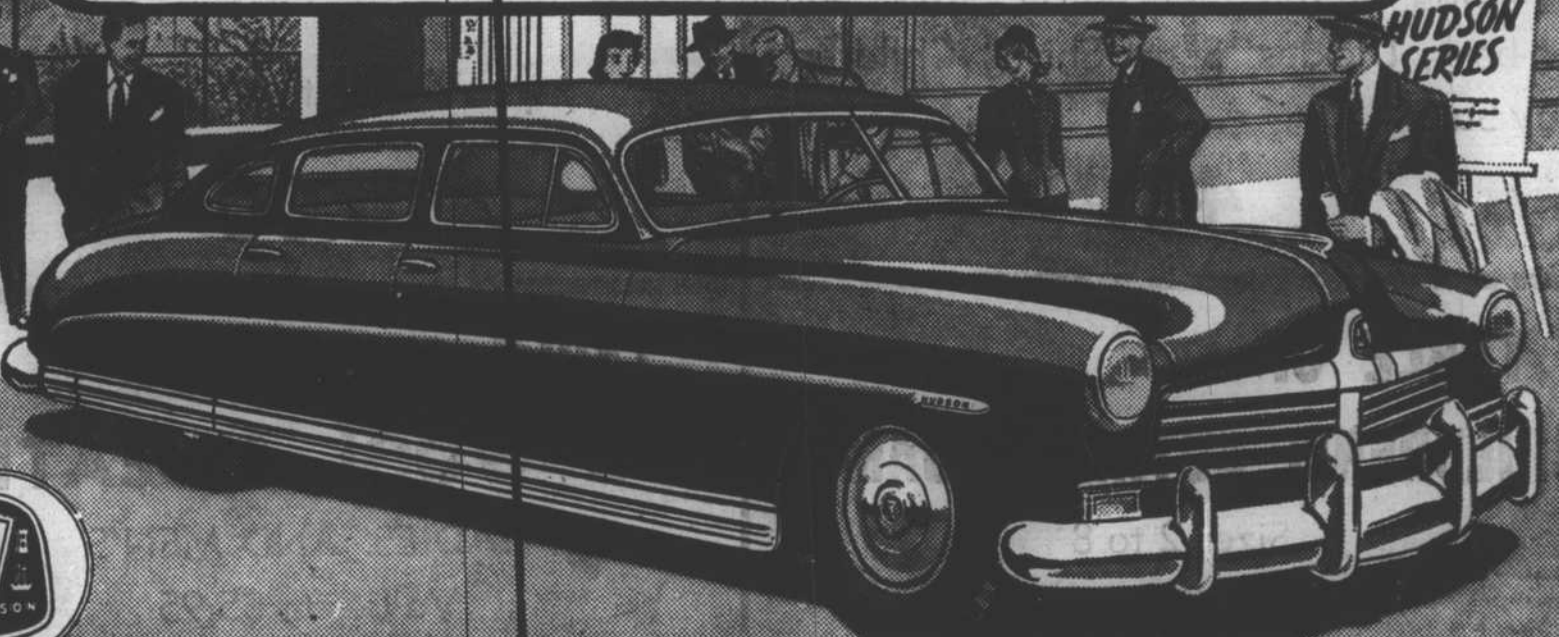
