

Marines May Yet Obtain Division Hist.

WILKESBORO, March 26 — Farm-ers members of the 3rd Marine Division who have not been supplied with a copy of the Third Marine Division History, published by the INFANTRY JOURNAL, Incorporated, may still obtain their copy, it was announced today.

Marines and former Marines, officer and enlisted, who served with the 3rd Marine Division between 15 September, 1942, and 2 September, 1945, and naval personnel attached to that division, may obtain the division's history by writing to the Infantry Journal, Inc., 1115 17th Street, N. W., Washington 6, D. C.

The next of kin of deceased members of the division who served during the specified period may also obtain a copy. In addition, officers and men who served in non-divisional units attached to the 3rd Marine Division during any of its campaigns may secure copies of the history on request until the supply is exhausted.

In order to receive one of the 2400 copies yet to be distributed, persons entitled to the publication are urged to include in their letters, name and present address, unit with which they served in the 3rd Marine Division, and the period during which they served.

Women IN THE CHURCH

Here's another week for your calendar. . . . It's National Young Woman's Christian Association Week, from April 24 through April 30. Church women of every communion are being urged to visit their "YW" during this week, see the activities that are carried on for local women and girls, and relate themselves also to the worldwide services of the "YW" in 6 nations. "The YWCA is your window to the world" is the week's slogan. There are 3,000,000 members of the "YW" in more than 1,000 branches.

Miss Jane Doolittle, Presbyterian missionary promoting the "Iran Bethel Project" in Teheran, Iran, reports that a home has been purchased for the growing community service center which now operates a library, sewing classes, health clinic nursery school, and Bible classes for the city. The center has grown out of the needs of young women who formerly attended the Christian school maintained by the mission.

"The city of Manila is taking on a new look," reports Miss Roxie Lefforge, missionary in that Philippine island city. "We no longer live in a ghost community. The Harris Memorial School has moved into the newly reconstructed Wilson Hall. Everywhere new buildings are going up, ruins are being torn down, and old buildings are having their faces lifted. The sea wall is almost whole again. The streets are being repaired and beautified. People are waiting for the first signs of the 'phoenix' which is expected to arise from the ashes of the old Central Student Church." The Methodist Clinic at Sittawan, Perak, Federation of Malaya, opened twenty years ago by Miss Mechteld Dirksen, R. N., of Mount Vernon, N. Y., and closed during the years of Japanese control of the territory, has again been opened. "My first venture in preventive medicine was to take over the health examinations of 650 children in the Anglo-Chinese School (Methodist English School)," says Miss Dirksen. "Even such superficial examinations showed a great many defects and deficiencies. Many were undernourished, and we supplied them with the food-supplement which I brought out from home. The teeth of the younger children especially were very bad; about 7 per cent had defective vision, and a great number have trachoma. The former are being attended to by an eye-

specialist in Ipoh; the latter was treated in the Clinic."

The United Council of Church Women is one of the principal sponsors of the nationwide radio program, "One Great Hour" which is to be heard over CBS, ABC, and MBS networks from 10 to 11 p.m. (E. S. T.), Saturday, March 26 in promotion of the church wide simultaneous offering the following day at church services for Church World Service and the denominational relief agencies which comprise that body. The radio drama showing need for relief and rehabilitation in Europe and Asia, is said to be the greatest radio production of its kind in the history of that medium of information. It was written and will be produced by Barnouw. The Sunday offering will be taken in 76,000 Protestant churches where the attendance is estimated at 50,000,000 persons.

Meeting in national convention in San Francisco, Cal., from March 7 to 14, the Young Woman's Christian Association of the United States adopted a public affairs program that urged support to legislation to eliminate discrimination based on sex, color, religion, or race; and gave support to measures looking toward federal aid in education, low-cost housing to rid American cities of slums, prohibition of child labor, strengthening of fair labor practices, support of the United Nations, and strengthening of public health services. The convention of 2,000 women represented 3,000,000 YW members in 1049 branches in the United States, and other thousands in 68 countries overseas where the YW has services.

Resolution Calling Primary

At a meeting duly called for the Board of Elections for Wilkes County, on motion duly seconded and carried, it is hereby ordered and carried, it is hereby ordered that the Primary for the Town of North Wilkesboro to nominate Mayor, Members of the Town Board of Commissioners and School Trustees for said town be held on Monday, April 18th, 1949, and the Election shall be held on Tuesday, May 3, 1949.

On motion duly seconded and carried, Montie Handy was appointed Registrar and Glenn Cox and Joe Godby were appointed Judges to hold said Municipal Primary and Election for the said Town of North Wilkesboro, and that said Primary and Election shall be conducted and carried on under and pursuant with the laws now in force governing Town Primaries and Election for the Town of North Wilkesboro.

It is further ordered that said Primary and Election be held in the City Hall, North Wilkesboro, N. C., only voting place, for the Town Primary and Election, located on "B" Street; it is further ordered that registration books be kept open for new qualified registrants at City Hall, North Wilkesboro, on Saturday, March 26, 1949; Saturday, April 2, 1949; Saturday, April 9, 1949; and Saturday, April 16, 1949 is hereby designated challenge day; and the Registrar herein appointed shall be in the City Hall on the Saturdays heretofore mentioned and discharge his duties as said Registrar in accordance with the laws governing registration and challenging of voters.

That all qualified electors desiring to vote in the Municipal Primary and Election for the Town of North Wilkesboro, unless already registered for Town Elections, shall register at the place above designated on or before Saturday, April 9, 1949.

It is further ordered that all candidates for nomination for town offices and school trustees file their notice of candidacy at least five days before the Primary herein called, accompanied by a fee of two dollars with the Chairman of the Board of Elections for Wilkes County, in accordance with the provisions of law now governing primaries and elections for the Town of North Wilkesboro.

It is further ordered that a copy of these resolutions be posted at the door of the Town Hall for the Town of North Wilkesboro, and that a copy be published in the local newspaper for the Town of North Wilkesboro.


