## Speaker and Chemist To Lecture At School

M. H. Bruner, experienced speaker on chemical progress as it affects the average American, will talk to the student body of North Wilkesboro school on April 8 at 2:15 and will demonstrate several scores of the newest developments of modern chemical research, some of them yet to be publicly introduced. The program was arranged through Carolina Assemblies, Mr. Woodward announced.

Mr. Bruner is southern manager of the Extension Division of E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Company, with his headquarters in Clemson, South Carolina. During the past five years, he has appeared before scores of civic clubs, high school and college groups in the Southern States.

Mr. Bruner is a graduate in forestry of Pennsylvania State College and has a master's degree from the Yale School of Forestry. He has had experience with the U. S. Forest Service in North Carolina, Tennessee, and Louisiana, and with the Agricultural Extension Service in Arkansas and South Carolina.

## Many Stray Dogs In N. Wilkesboro Are To Be Killed

### Dogs Not Vaccinated And Running Loose Will Be Destroyed Here

Police Chief J. E. Walker said here today that stray dogs are becoming a menace in North Wilkesboro and that one child has been bitten by a dog believed to be rabid.

Stray dogs, apparently without owners and certainly not being confined or cared for, are becoming more numerous in North Wilkesboro, particularly in the eastern part of town. Many of these dogs have been hanging around the school buildings, creating a dangerous menace to all children around the school grounds.

In the interest of safety the police have no choice but to kill the stray dogs which have no apparent owners.

Police are requesting that all who have dogs have them vaccinated and to keep them confined according to law.

A. J. Brown, legally appointed dog vaccinator for North Wilkesboro township, will be at Kyle's store on Highway 268 near Turner Oil company station all day Saturday, April 9, for the purpose of vaccinating dogs. This represents a convenient opportunity for dog owners to have their dogs immunized as the law provides.

The vaccination fee is 50 cents for each dog, and half of the fee, or 21 cents per dog, may be applied on county taxes.

## Blue Goatskin Binds Atlantic Document

Washington, April 4.—The North Atlantic treaty signed today is a 15-page typewritten document, bound in blue goatskin and decorated with a red, white, and blue ribbon.

Its 1,040-word text is in both English and French, in parallel columns.

When the document was stowed away in a state department

vault after the signing ceremony it bore 23 signatures. Under the protocol arrangements only Secretary Acheson signed for the United States. Each of the other countries had two signers—its foreign minister and its envoy to the United States.

Each of the foreign nations will get a photostatic copy of the official text, but the original remains in the possession of the state department.

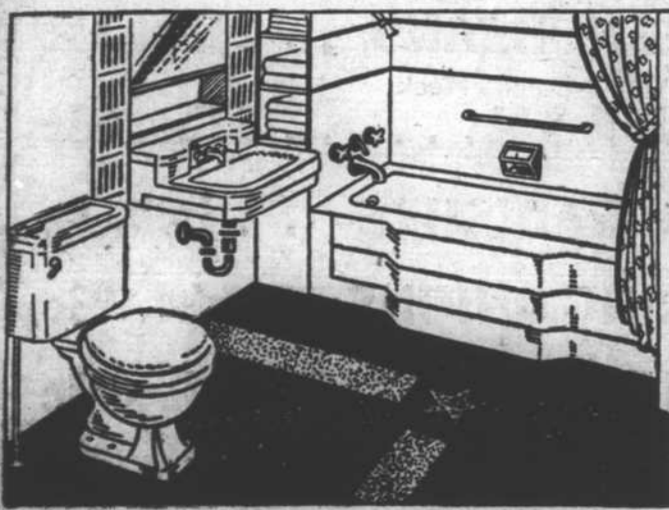
