Some of the most interesting landmarks seen by McNeil were the site of the famous Colossus of Rhodes, the huge bronze statue that was one of the wonders of the ancient world; the huge wall, built in 408 B. C., that surrounds the city itself; Mussolini's Baseball Schedule medieval-style castle built in 1937 as a summer home; and the Street of Knights with the Crusaders' coats of arms in stone above each doorway. 
