The president called a meeting of the executive committee. A special offering was taken to buy Bibles for the prison camp.—Reported.

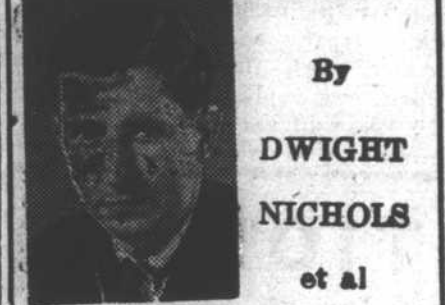
