Wedding music was provided by Mrs. Charlie Warren, pianist, and Miss Virginia Isaacs, soloist. White gladioli, pines, and an ivy covered arch, lighted by white candles in branched-candelabra formed a nuptial setting.

Mrs. Clyde Shumaker was matron of honor, Miss Imogene Hall, sister of the bridegroom, and Mrs. Edward Pendry were bridesmaids. The matron of honor wore a gown of aqua taffeta with
