The next Board meeting was set for July, to be held at the Council Camp Lasater.

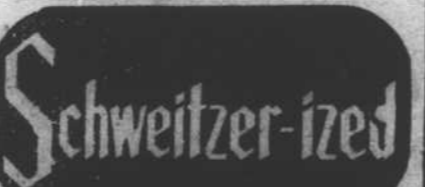
