Raleigh.—The Motor Vehicle Department announced today that all Chauffeurs' licenses in the State must be renewed by June 30. Department officials said there

were approximately 36,500 motorists in the State who held Chauffeurs' licenses, and the law states that these licenses must be renewed by midnight June 30.

Previously, the largest number of arrests made in a single month was in June, 1947, when 704 arrests were made.

Most of the commission's arrests last month, Lupton said, were for: Fishing without a license, taking under-sized fish, netting and trapping fish in inland waters, and exceeding the creel limits.
