In 1948 Frank Lasky, then working in the Aleutians as a civilian employee of the Army, contributed \$400 to the American Red Cross, saying in a note: "Since I am making good wages now, I would like to give to those who really need it."

In 1948 Mr. Lasky was back in Bridgeport, Conn., purchasing a large home for his wife and 15 children. Winter clothing and many other belongings were stored on the third floor when flames swept through the upper story destroying most of it.

Household furnishings and other possessions on the first and second floors were ruined or damaged by water and smoke.

Needing some assistance, since the residence was being bought on monthly installments and because two of the boys had lost their jobs, the family was "adopted" by the Bridgeport Red Cross chapter. It provided bedding, furniture, clothing, and food because the chapter felt the same way about people "who really need it."

AAA District Meet Held In Wilkesboro

Representatives from Yadkin, Surry, Alexander, Caldwell and Wilkes county attended a AAA meeting at the Community House in Wilkesboro on Tuesday, May 10. N. L. Wilson, state office official, was in charge and gave further instructions regarding possible wheat marketing quotas.

The probability of having marketing quotas on wheat, which is the reason for the survey of past acreages, is due to the increasing amount of carryover, plus increasing acreage and yields per acre. "The carryover is what is increasing in spite of the large amount of wheat we have been exporting, and it is not considered likely that we shall in the future export as much as we have in the past few years. The law requires the Secretary of Agriculture to declare marketing quotas when the total supply of wheat is larger than the reserve supply level. This information should be available in order that farmers may know why the survey has been made," Mrs. Maude S. Miller, AAA secretary, said.

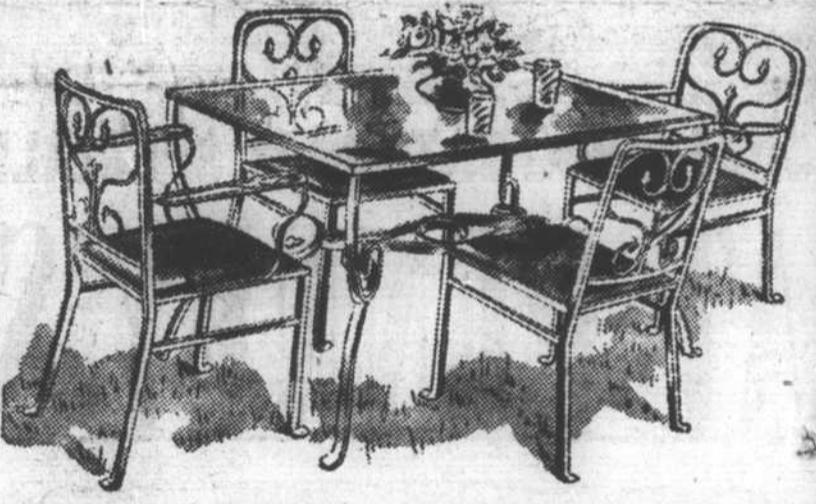
