



sharply divided Supreme Court held today that freedom of speech cannot be curbed merely because the speaker stirs people to anger, invites public dispute planned, prepared and served 20 and creates unrest.

Justice Jackson, one of a fourman minority, called the decision a "dogma of absolute freedom for irresponsible and provocative utterance" which almost completely ties the hands of local officers trying to maintain peace.


