SCOTT TO ADDRESS ROADS, SCHOOL RALLY AT ELKIN Y.M.C.A. MAY 21ST

Governor W. Kerr Scott will address a rally in behalf of better schools and roads, the rally to be held Saturday night, May 21, eight o'clock, in the Gilvin Roth Y. M. C. A. in Elkin.

C. H. Farrell, of Elkin, Surry county co-chairman of Better Schools and Roads, Inc., was here Tuesday making arrangements with Watson Brame, Wilkes chairman of Better Schools and Roads, to have a large delegation from Wilkes attend the rally at Elkin.

The rally is planned as a special event for the entire Eighth highway division of ten counties, in the interest of getting out a large vote for the state road and school bond election to be held on June 4.

In addition to Governor Scott, there will be other state leaders at the Elkin rally, which is expected to attract a record crowd.

RATS COSTING WILKES \$85,000

War has been declared on a public enemy of ours, Mr. Rat. Careful studies made in this country have revealed that it cost us approximately \$2.00 a year to support one of these rats. They are very choosy and they damage or destroy more food than they actually consume. One will note that on this basis it is costing Wilkes county approximately \$85,000 to feed our rat population per year, since there are about two to one in population.

The one most commonly found in this area is the Norway rat, which is a brown, rather large animal living in sewers, under houses and around barns and stables, confining his activities mostly to the basement and first floors.

Because of the close living conditions between rats and man a real threat to our public health is evident, Typhus fever being the most prevalent disease. The

flea which is found on the back of the rat is the carrier of the disease. Leaving the rat and biting man transmits the danger. The prevalence of Typhus Fever in North Carolina has shown an increase in recent years. Rats multiply so rapidly that within three years two rats will leave a posterity of about three million if all of the offspring survive.

The municipalities of the Wilkesboro in cooperation with the Health Department are going to instigate a poisoning campaign for these pests. The baiting for this program will start Tuesday, May 24. The materials used will be Red Squill placed throughout the towns in little torpedoes consisting of one part Red Squill and nine parts of a fish-chow body. This poison is not dangerous to domestic animals or humans. However, precautions should be taken regarding pets.

Everyone is asked to cooperate with the workers in seeing that garbage and hiding places in and around the home have been cleaned up. We would like to have a very hungry rat population on Tuesday when the program is put into effect.

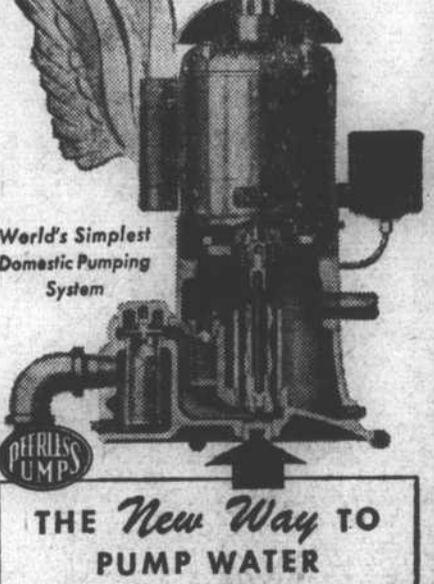
