Items Of Interest To All Fruit Growers

By CARL E. VANDEMAN (Assistant County Agent) To All Fruit Growers:

Would you like to hear a complete report on the apple crop in the eastern states? If so, come to the fruit growers' meeting on Wednesday, June 8th at 8:00 p. m., at the Pores Knob Community House located on Highway 16 a few miles south of Moravian Falls.

The International Apple Association is sending Mr. Fred Burrows from Rochester, N. Y., to visit apple growing sections in the Shenandoah Valley and western North Carolina. This will be an excellent opportunity to hear and discuss apple crop prospects with a man who has the latest information about the crop in the entire country.

Plenty of time will be left to discuss insect and disease control problems. Codling moth worms are bad in some orchards. Other growers have acted quickly when there were too many early worms entering the fruit and put on DDT. This material stopped them when lead arsenate would not stop a heavy infestation. DDT is not as effective when used with Bordeaux mixture (because of the excess lime) as when used with Fermate or wettable sulfur or a combination of these last two materials.

Green apple aphids are getting too thick in some orchards. Where these are mostly on the watersprouts, it is best to break these off and thus destroy the aphids and their feed places. In orchards where there are aphids on the apples it is best to use one of the following materials to clean them up before they mess up the fruit: either Nicotine Sulphate (Blackleaf 40) which requires warm weather with no wind to be effective; or parathion at the rate of one pound of 15 per cent wettable powder per 100 gallons of spray. Parathion will help in the control of codling moth, leaf roller, and red mite as well as aphids but is not as effective when used in spray mixtures containing lime. It works well with Fermate. Nicotine works better with Bordeaux or other sprays containing lime.
