Leon Postove, a pitching veteran of the North State League, was signed Tuesday, Tal J. Pearson, club president, announced, and the big right hander joined the club Wednesday. Postove was obtained from the Hickory club, where he had a very creditable record. Last year he won 11 and lost 7, and his earned run average was 3.86.

A new rookie pitcher is Carl Gentry, rangy right hander who graduated from Sparta high school several days ago. In high school baseball he pitched more than a dozen games and lost only two. He has also pitched in the Grayson semi-pro league for the Sparta team. Carl is 19 years of age, is 6-1 tall and tips the scales at 190. He had been working out with the Flashers earlier this week and signed Tuesday.
