Mr. Clyde Kilby, a merchant of the Mulberry community, is a patient at the Wilkes hospital, where he is receiving treatment for several days.

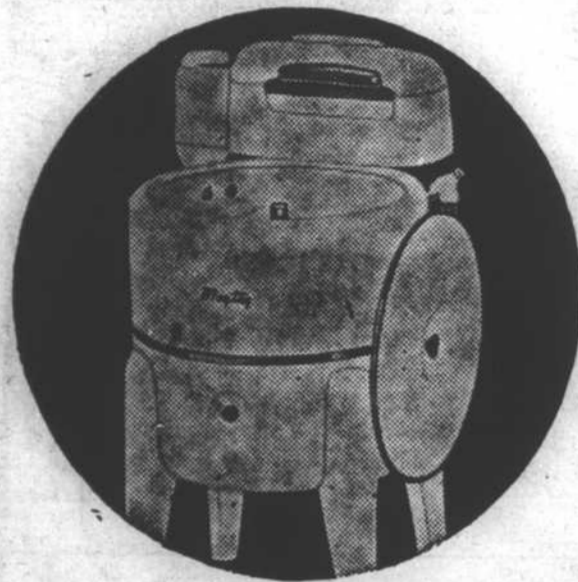
