Soil Conservation In Wilkes

George Forester, whose farm is located just off the Round Mountain Road below Hays, N. C., will soon be able to harvest fence posts from the locust trees set on his place by the Soil Conservation Service a few years ago.

Tam Hutchinson, whose poultry farm can be seen on Highway 268 just out of North Wilkesboro, says that a good soil holding sod of grass and legumes is the best way to utilize the manure from his chicken house. Anyone passing the road can readily see the results.

Jonah Parker, whose farm is located in the Gilreath section of the Brushy Mountains, said he watched his terraces fill near the top in the recent hard rains, but they held. He had such a close call he plans to plow the terraces higher and wider this fall.

Charlie Proffit, of Goshen, has a very good stand of orchard grass and ladino clover on a four-acre bottom land field that he seeded this spring. All of his old pasture is on steep upland where grazing was short during dry weather. This addition of bottom land pasture, Charlie says, will give the hill pasture the necessary relief.

Subsistence Checks Are Being Delayed

Washington, June 30.—Subsistence checks for 500,000 veterans in school or taking on-the-job training will be delayed a few days, the Veterans Administration said today.

It explained that the checks, totaling \$48,000,000, were not mailed out today because the agency ran out of money by mistake. It added, however, that Congress is providing emergency funds for the start of the new fiscal year beginning tomorrow and the checks will be mailed in "the next few days."
