Invitation For Bids

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the Wilkes County Board of Education, Wilkes County Courthouse, Wilkesboro, N. C., at 2 p. m., Wednesday, July 27th, 1949, for the construction of an elementary class room building at Somers township, North Wilkesboro, N. C.

Building will be of Class 'C', construction of wood joists, wood floors, masonry walls, steel sash and built up roof, consisting of seven rooms, offices, toilets, etc., as more clearly described by plans and specifications prepared by Coffey and Olson, architects, of Lenoir, N. C.

Separate proposals will be received on the general construction, and electrical work. No proposals will be received on plumbing and heating at this time.

Proposals will be considered only from contractors who submit evidence that they are licensed to practice contracting of their respective trades in the State of North Carolina and that they will abide by all state laws governing the practice of same.

Certified checks in the amount of 2 per cent of the proposal drawn to the order of the Wilkes County Board of Education, on a bank or trust company authorized to do business in the State of North Carolina, must accompany each proposal.

Plans and specifications may be obtained from the office of the architects until 12 noon, July 25, 1949, upon deposit of TWENTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$25.00), for each set of plans and specifications. Deposit will be refunded upon return in good condition of said plans and specifications together with a bona fide bid, not later than 2 p. m., July 25, 1949.

Plans and specifications will be on file in the plan room of the Associated General Contractors of America, Builders Building, Charlotte, N. C., and the office of the Wilkes County Board of Education, courthouse, Wilkesboro, N. C.

No proposals will be considered unless all of the above conditions are complied with.
