The President said that within its inner circle, the Soviet orbit "manifests the fatal weakness of all dictatorships."

Tired of Dictatorships "The world is tired of political fanaticism", he also said. "It is weary of the lies, propaganda. and hysteria created by dictatorships. Touching at another point on what he called the weaknesses of the totalitarian structure, Truman told the crowd:


"Between totalitarian states, disagreements can suddenly become open conflicts and allies can change into enemies overnight."
