Special Discounts On Kerosene For Curing Tobacco

An added saving in the cost of curing this year's tobacco crop estimated at \$450,000 could accrue to North Carolina farmers from the allowance of a special discount of one-half cent per gallon from regular posted kerosene prices on deliveries to consumers in July and August. Such a policy has been announced by Esso Standard Oil Company.

According to F. M. Fletcher, District Manager, this "special summer discount," which was put into effect to stimulate the "off season" movement of kerosene and heating oil from refineries and terminals to customers' storage nearer the place of consumption in anticipation of the heavy demands for home heating next winter, coincides with the tobacco farmers' season of peak demand. It is estimated that 100,000 tobacco barns are equipped with kerosene-burning burners and will require approximately 90,000,000 gallons this season. Any added saving resulting from the "special summer discount" comes on top of declines in the regular posted tankwagon prices of kerosene during the past year amounting to 1.2 cents to 1.4 cents per gal-
