**Opera Director**



ROBERT C. BIRD

A State-Wide plan to bring opera in English to every North Carolina music-lover is being worked out by Robert C. Bird, talented young Ohio musician, and A. J. Fletcher of Raleigh, who is State Opera Chairman for the North Carolina Federation of Music Clubs. Mr. Bird, who was engaged by Mr. Fletcher to direct the program, now is setting up headquarters in Raleigh. Mr. Bird will be available to communities that want to present operas, or selections from operas, with either local talent or talent available in other North Carolina communities. Mr. Fletcher, who conceived the plan, aims to make opera as popular in North Carolina as other types of music, including hill-billy tunes. He also intends to furnish a medium for the voices and acting ability of North Carolina singers who have no other outlet for their talents.

Mr. Bird came to Raleigh from Fort Worth, Texas, where he directed the Civic Opera Guild. A baritone and expert on stage settings, he has sung and worked with operatic groups in New Orleans, Mobile, Ala., and Jackson, Miss. During the past summer he directed the Colony Opera Guild at Schroom Lake, N. Y. Now 31, he is a veteran of overseas service with the Army. **Man, Being Tried For 35-Year - Old Murder**

Washington, Iowa. — A 63-year-old man went on trial yesterday for a love-quarrel murder committed 35 years ago. Oscar Fetters, released early this year after spending 34 years in the criminal insane ward of the State reformatory, is the defendant. He escaped trial at the time of the crime by being declared insane.

Fetters is accused of slaying Hugh Dougall, Sr. in a quarrel over attentions paid by Fetters to Dougall's daughter, Sara. Prosecuting the case is county attorney Paul V. Shearer, who was not born until five years after the shooting.

**1217 Enrolled In Appalachian Now**

Boone.—The enrollment at Appalachian State Teachers college has climbed to the highest figure in the history of the institution. 1217 students already have registered, and it is estimated that the graduates yet to register will swell the figure to at least 1250 or perhaps 1300 before the end of the week.

Approximately thirty-five students are enrolled in graduate classes off-campus at North Wilkesboro. About the same number will enroll for classes at Morganton where a similar center has been established. Chapell Wilson, dean of the graduate school, estimates that an enrollment of 125 will be reached in the graduate school.

The college also had the largest summer enrollment it has ever had. More than 2000 different enrollments were registered from nineteen states, three foreign countries and one territory. There were 238 working for the master's degree and 586 college graduates attending the institution.

Eleven faculty members have been added to the faculty to help take care of the larger enrollment. They include Dr. Pearl S. McCarty, department of English; Dr. Mildred D. Babcock, department of education; Dr. C. W. Simms, department of education; Dr. C. R. Walker, department of department of library science; James T. Thompson, department of business education; Golden T. Buckland, department of mathematics; Miss Grace Hollifield, department of Home Economics; Miss June Dinkins, department of physical education; Bobby Wayne Cox, department of music; and Mrs. Elsie Erneston, department of music.

**Farmer Dies Under Wheels Of Tractor**

Winston-Salem.—Crushed by the wheel of a tractor, Felix Sylvester Tesh, 65-year-old dairy farmer, was found dead yesterday on his farm near Clemmons.

Sheriff Ernie G. Shore, who investigated the accident, said Mr. Tesh was believed to have been dead about 30 minutes when found.

"Mr. Tesh had backed his tractor up to a mower and apparently had leaned back to connect a power kickoff when he accidentally threw the tractor into gear and was thrown off," the sheriff said. "The tractor moved only a short distance, coming to halt against a bank, with one of the wheels still on the driver's head."
