1217 Enrolled in **Appalachian Now**

Boone.—The enrollment at Appalachian State Teachers college has climbed to the highest figure in the history of the institution. 1217 students already have registered, and it is estimated that the graduates yet to register will swell the figure to at least 1250 or perhaps 1300 before the end of the week.

Approximately thirty-five students are enrolled in graduate classes off-campus at North Wilkesboro. About the same number will enroll for classes at Morganton where a similar center has been established. Chapell Wilson, dean of the graduate school, estimates that an enrollment of 125 will be reached in the graduate school.

The college also had the largest summer enrollment it has ever had. More than 2000 different enrollments were registered from nineteen states, three foreign countries and one territory. There were 238 working for the master's degree and 586 college graduates attending the institu-


