active vocational guidance program for the whole student body. The idea spread together sections and state organizations were set up. In 1943 an international organization was set up for Canada and the United States, with an international convention each year to which delegates are sent; also a district convention is held annually. Next spring the convention of the Carolinas district will be held in Winston-Salem, and it is hoped that the whole membership of the local Key Clubs will attend.

Contrary to the thought of some, the Key Club is not organized to build future Kiwanians. The real reason for the Key Club is service, the unselfish service to faculty, to fellow students and to the school; service activities of the club are carried on through different committees, to build better communities. The projects are suggested, considered and accomplished—projects to maintain and improve the school property, to raise funds for various needs, to help the school community.

The late Roe Fulkerson summarized the idea of the Key Club in an editorial of the Kiwanis Magazine in 1946, here quoted: "Do you know of a group that gives separate appreciation banquets to their mothers and fathers each year, provides tests and holds vocational guidance clinics every year so that others may find their proper place in the community, and makes a habit of cooperating with those in authority in all matters that need to be done, when there is no one else to do them? No? Then you have never heard of a Key Club.

"When you were in school, did you make yourself a committee of one to welcome new students? When someone threw waste paper on the school grounds or in the school buildings, did you tactfully call it to his attention or else pick it up yourself? When a teacher called for a leader to take charge of a group of students, were you trained to assist him? No? Then you didn't belong to the Key Club.

"Do the students of your high school have frequent contact with the business and professional leaders of your community? Are they getting practice in doing the kind of tasks they will be called on to do as adults? Are they organized and trained to think and be of use to the community? No? Then your school doesn't have a Key Club.

"Did you ever attend a meeting and hear the presiding officer call for volunteers to sell tickets, scrub names off toilet walls, or do some other distasteful task that had to be done, and invariably get more volunteers than were needed? No? Then you have never attended a Key Club meeting.

"Every one of these things, and many like them, happen wherever there is a Key Club. They can happen in your school, and there is no other high school group that performs the functions of a Key Club. Every competent principal welcomes this unselfish character-building cooperation to supplement and support his school program. Every superior high school boy thrills at belonging to a high school service club that gives him "that certain something" which cannot be found in his text books. This is your challenge and opportunity to build character and citizenship in tomorrow's leaders."
