

Cranberry Wins Again 33 To 0

When Cranberry and Millers Creek high school football teams clash the score has a habit of being Cranberry 33 and Millers Creek 0.

The two teams met at Cranberry Friday afternoon and the score was the same, 33 to 0. That was the identical score when Cranberry played Millers Creek at Millers Creek earlier in the season.

The Millers Creek lads drove to the 25 in opening minutes and the drive bogged down. Cranberry put on a march and the scoring play was a 40-yard run around end by Buchanan, who was a "thorn in the flesh" all afternoon for Millers Creek.

The next Cranberry score was a thrilling 80-yard sprint, and the third came on a line plunge. An intercepted pass on the 10 set up the fourth and Cranberry drove 40 yards after a Millers Creek fumble for the final marker. Points were made on running plays.
