

Appalachian B Team Wins Over Catawba B 7-0

Jack Groce Gets Loose For 75 Yards And Only Score Of The Game Here

Jack Groce, Wilkesboro lad who made an enviable record at Wilkesboro in high school, broke the game wide open here Thursday night when he scampered for 75 yards and the only score of the ball game as Appalachian Baby Mountaineers defeated the Rinkydinks of Catawba College 7 to 0.

The crowd of about 1,200 had little to get excited about until the third quarter when Jack faked a reverse and ran around left end down the sidelines to get away from all tacklers.

Appalachian threatened several times during the game and amassed a total of 308 yards rushing. But Catawba's defenses held like a stone wall inside the 20-yard line on four scoring threats. The Rinkydinks threatened in opening minutes of the game, going to the 12-yard line and never could get up steam again. Most exciting play of the

first period was a 41-yard run by Jim Moore, of Winston-Salem, a Baby Mountaineer half-back. That drive carried to the 12 and bogged.

In the second period Jack Groce brought the crowd to their feet with a run of 52 yards to the 22-yard line but the drive bogged down on the six with a fourth down pass dropped in the end zone.

The third period had all the scoring, when Groce maneuvered his brilliant run and Davis added the point from placement.

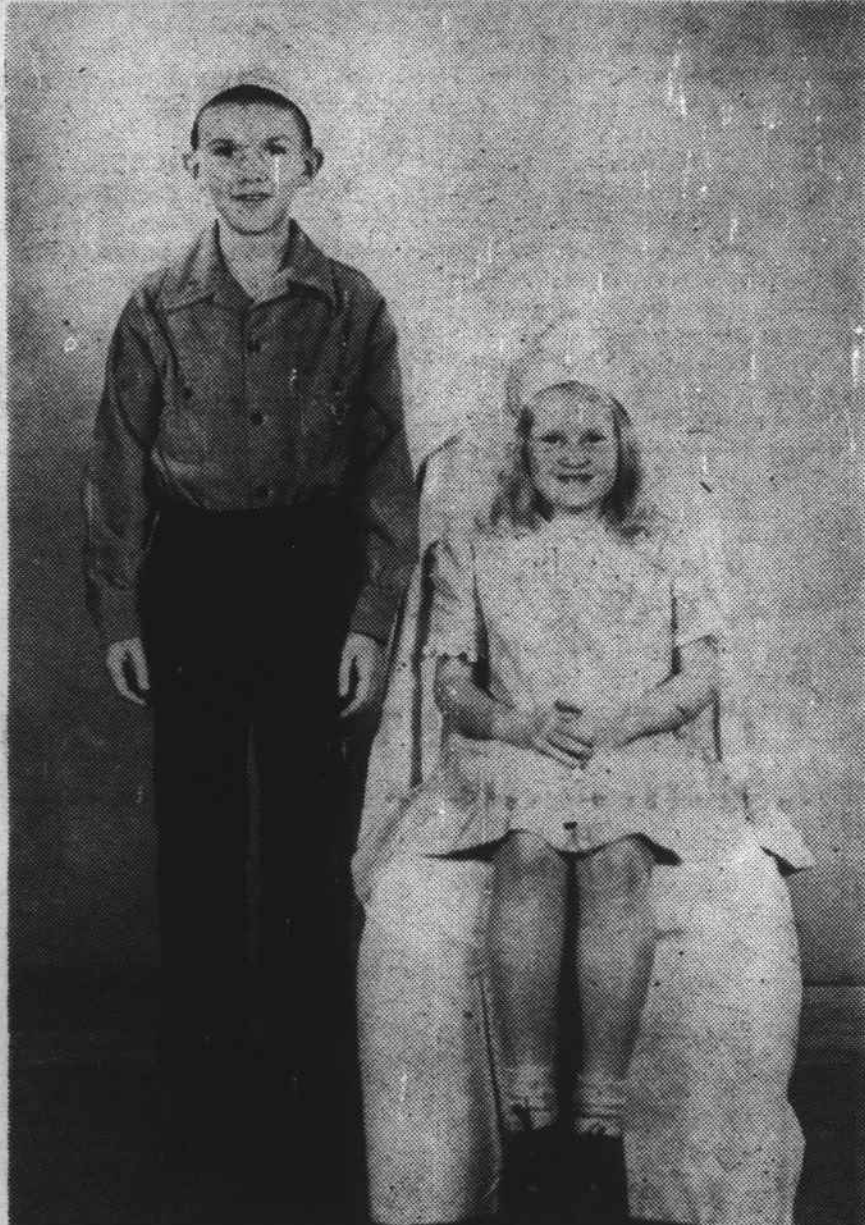
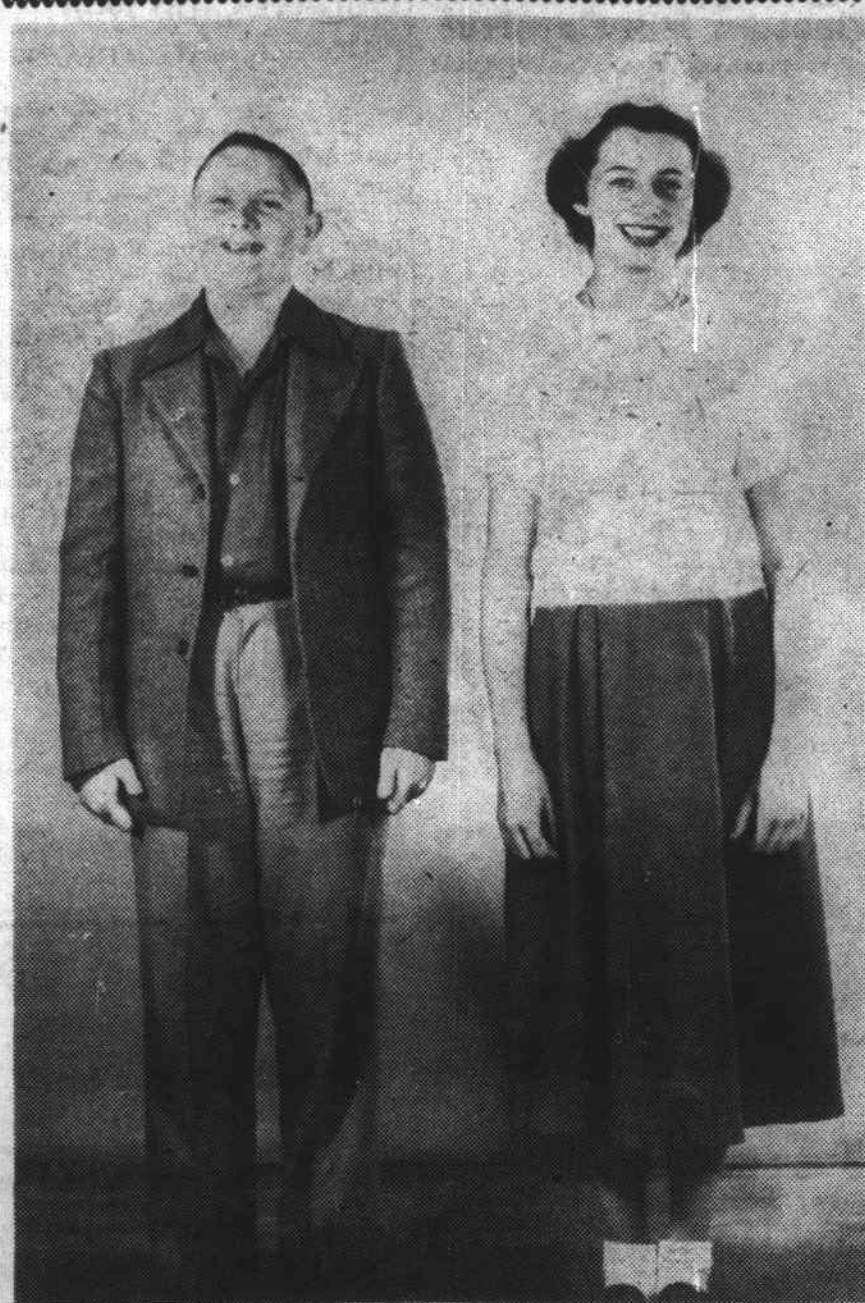
Claude Eldridge, of Elkin, who played brilliantly for Appalachian on defense, gave the crowd something to cheer about in the fourth quarter when he returned a Catawba punt from the 35 to the ten-yard line, but there Appalachian was held again.

In the closing minutes, Catawba's ace passer, Joe Popp, connected with a 40-yard heave to Hunnesucker. But the passing drive was stopped when Ben Hunnicutt, of Appalachian, got a Popp pass and ran it back 61 yards to the Catawba 20-yard line, where the game ended with Appalachian threatening.

The game Thursday night was sponsored by the North Wilkesboro quarterback club.
