

### Deane To Run For House Again, Assails Dissident Democrats

Washington. — Representative Charles B. Deane again yesterday deflated rumors that he is about to become a candidate for the U. S. Senate in the 1950 elections in North Carolina. "I am a candidate for re-election to the House," said Deane, who is now serving his second term.

Noting that "some newspaper commentator on a radio program in North Carolina" on Sunday asserted that he (Deane) would be a senatorial candidate next year, Deane told reporters: "Again I wish to say that I am entirely

too busy trying to serve the needs of my constituency in the Eighth North Carolina Congressional District and those of our country to enter into any partisan political discussions.

"I will say, however, that I will not be drawn into any discussions with anyone who may have acknowledged supporting the Republican national ticket in both 1944 and 1948. I have been convinced since 1944, and it was made very clear to me in 1948, that there are certain forces at work within North Carolina who profess to be Democrats yet are doing everything they can to divide and discredit the Democratic party in our State, and I shall not be involved in their activities."

While the Rockingham Congressman declined to identify the "newspaper commentator" whose radio broadcast was referred to, it was understood here that the person concerned was Robert L. Thompson, editor of the High Point (N. C. Enterprise).

Asked if the active leaders of the Dixiecrat movement in North Carolina in 1948 were among those "who profess to be Democrats, yet are doing everything they can to divide and discredit the Democratic party in our State," Deane replied: "Certainly, the Dixiecrats knew perfectly well they were harming the Democratic party."
