## Cities In Four States Promote U. S. Highway 421

### This Community Represented At Bristol Meeting

#### Organization Formed To Make Boone Trail Coast to Lakes Scenic Route

Representatives of cities and towns of North Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia and Kentucky met in Bristol, Tenn.-Va., to form an organization to be known as U. S. Highway 421 Association.

The event was sponsored by the Bristol Chamber of Commerce and was attended by more than 300 representatives of interested cities and towns along the route of the famous highway.

Purpose of the organization is to seek improvement of sections of highway 421 which are not in good condition, to extend marking of highway 421 north-west to the Great Lakes at or

near Chicago, and to promote the use of highway 421 as a scenic route to be known as Coast to Lakes scenic highway.

The subject is of much interest here because highway 421 traverses Wilkes county east to west and goes through the Wilkesboros.

W. J. Bason, chairman of the Highways and Roads committee of the Wilkes Chamber of Commerce was the representative from the Wilkesboros attending the Bristol organization meeting.

The plan of organization for the U. S. Highway 421 Association calls for a vice president from each of the states affected. S. C. Eggers, of Boone, is the vice president representing North Carolina. The board of directors will be composed of one member from each incorporated town on highway 421 from Fort Fisher, N. C., to Madison, Indiana. The board of directors will elect the president. Marvin W. Krieger, executive director of the Harlan, Ky., Chamber of Commerce, will be assistant to the president and will be acting head of the association until the board of directors and president are named.

Speakers at the Bristol meeting stated that with proper improvement and promotion U. S. Highway 421, which is called the Boone Trail in North Carolina, can become one of the nation's best known and most widely used highways.

It will also furnish a desperately needed commercial route between the Industrial Piedmont Area of North Carolina and the Midwest.
