Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Hendren and daughter, spent the weekend with Mrs. Hendren's parents, Mr. and Mrs. White.

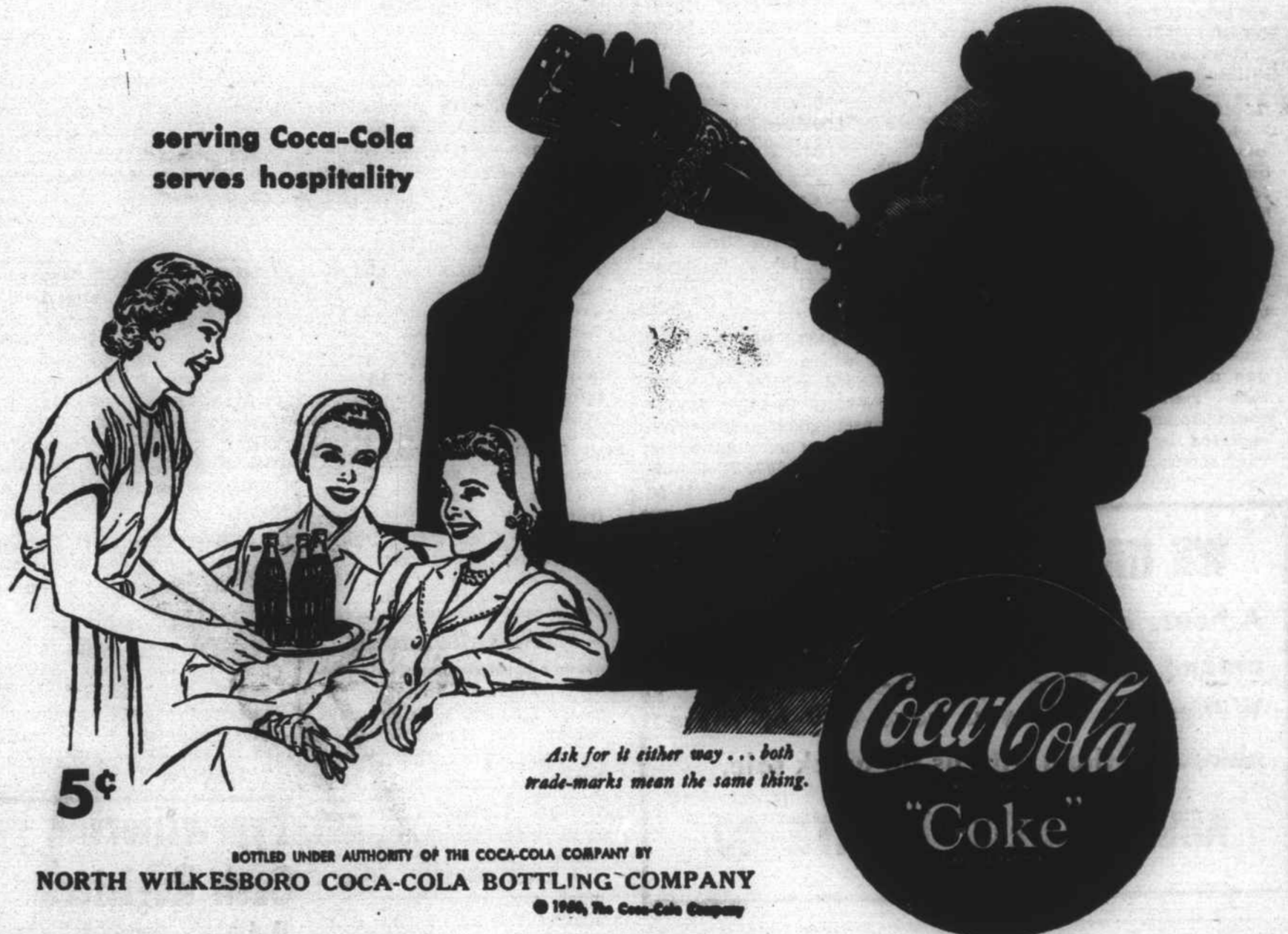
