

### Republicans Name Baley Chairman

Charlotte, March 14 — North Carolina Republicans in convention today chose new leaders trumpeted blasts of criticism at the Democrats, and adopted a platform calling for a state liquor referendum and condemning "appeals to racial prejudice embodied in FEPC."

The convention passed the helm of the party from the retiring veteran Jim Delapp of Lexington to 38-year-old Jim Baley of Madison County.

**Candidate Named**  
The Republicans named H. L. Gavin of Sanford as a candidate for the U. S. Senate from the East.

George N. Pritchard of Asheville, placing Gavin's name before the convention, nominated him to run against "Dr. Frank

Graham who has been accused of leanings too far to the left."

Leaders did not produce a nominee for the Senate from the West, but directed Chairman Baley's executive committee to "consider carefully" the selection of another Senate candidate.

**Large Attendance**  
Some 600 persons representing county units with a voting strength of more than 1,000, attended the annual parley and heard a keynote speaker, U. S. Senator Arthur V. Watkins, (Republicans, Utah) declare, "Republicans have been betrayed" in their agreement for a "bipartisan foreign policy and are being heckled unmercifully in their effort to rid the State Department of radicals."

Election of Baley as chairman gave the leadership to a westerner who, the committee was told is seriously considering bringing headquarters for the May primaries to the central part of the state.

#### Contest Spirited

Baley, a native of Greensboro, won on the second ballot in a spirited contest with Clyde R. Greene of Boone and Buford Henderson of Winston-Salem.

The vote on the deciding ballot was 546 for Baley to 467 for Greene, and 1 for Henderson. On the first ballot Baley had narrowly missed victory by 502 votes to 368 for Greene and 139 for Henderson. A majority vote was required.

Throughout the convention, one speaker after another blasted the Democratic Party as socialistic and urged the party to "rise in deadly opposition to the Socialist Party of North Carolina."
