

S. Sgt. Livingston Gets 1st Aid Course

Emaligen — S-Sgt. James D. Livingston of Route No. 1, Box 48, Boomer, North Carolina recently completed an intensive

course in first aid and accident prevention given under the supervision of the American Red Cross overseas, it was announced recently by ARC Safety Service officials in Europe.

S-Sgt. Livingston who is serving with the 59th Gen. Sup. Sq. stationed at Burtonwood, England is on duty with U. S. occupation forces in Europe. The safety course in which S-Sgt. Livingston was enrolled is part of a Command-wide program of the American Red Cross designed to train servicemen overseas in accident prevention and first aid techniques.

The course, set up in the form of a rotational school, provided S-Sgt. Livingston with 20 hours of practical and classroom work in first aid and accident prevention. As part of the curriculum,

Efforts Being Made To Find And Aid Those Entitled To Benefits

Director of the North Carolina Veterans Commission recently put out the following message relative to service officer work:

"Frankly we believe the time has come when all of us should make up our minds and really evermore concentrate on filing and successfully developing claims for all such disabled veterans who can become eligible to receive pension for permanent and total disability not due to their war service. Truly those men are all too often the 'forgotten veterans' in their communities.

"We respectfully, sincerely and earnestly appeal to each of you to please help us search out these forgotten men in every part of North Carolina, starting today and continuing to concentrate on this great effort for the next ninety days, to the end that all such disabled veterans shall receive the benefit of the kind of expert service, advice and help they so urgently need in filing claims of this kind. When you succeed in getting a Part III claim favorably acted upon, that means you have rendered a truly remarkable service to that individual disabled veteran from that time on as long as he lives, and it will also be a great service to his family and community. There are literally hundreds of such worthy disabled veterans in North Carolina — some in every county.

"This special drive and really organized effort in behalf of all such disabled men in North Carolina can be the real success such disabled veterans have a right to.

S-Sgt. Livingston and members of the class took part in a unique safety inspection of facilities on their military post. S-Sgt. Livingston and his classmates toured the post and noted safety hazards which were brought to the attention of the commanding officer for correction.

The ARC safety course was given by GI instructors trained under the supervision of ARC Safety Services representatives working in cooperation with the Armed Forces in Germany and Austria.

The first telephone loan made by the Rural Electrification Administration was to the Florida Telephone Company in Alabama.




