Cancer Center Has 25 On Tuesday

On Tuesday, March 14th, the Wilkes-Alleghany County Cancer Center held its weekly clinic. 25 appeared for examination, 16 white women, 6 white men, 3 colored women, 1 colored man.

Mrs. F. C. Hubbard, served as Chairman of Receptionists, and assisting her were Mrs. Joe Pearson, Mrs. Edison Norman, and Mrs. Albert Garwood.

Those who presided in the examining rooms were Mrs. C. C. McNeill, Mrs. W. C. Hayes, and Mrs. A. R. Gray, Sr.

Twenty-five examinations were completed, and 22 patients were referred to their personal physicians for medical attention.

The Center is staffed by members of the Wilkes-Alleghany County Medical Society.

4 priorities were given to those who arrived too late for examination.

There were several from out of town. 2 Came from Elkin, 2 from Furches, 1 from Jefferson, 1 from Booneville, 1 from Taylorsville, and 1 from Hiddentite.

Examinations are free to all women 35 or over, all men 40 or over, and to anyone with a symptom or a "danger signal," regardless of age.

The Clinics are held every Tuesday morning in the Wilkes County Court House. Registration is from 9:00 to 10:00.
