Some investigation was made relative to obtaining the necessary hardware, which consists of a few small pieces of steel, springs, screws, etc. John Wesley Bryan de ided to make the hardware and put in a shop at his home at Traphill. Already his shop has turned out hardware for several hundred tables.

The folding legs on the underneath side of the tray are sturdy and when in extended position make the little table so strong that a 25-pound object can be laid on a corner of the table without upsetting it or causing any damaging strain. When folded up the legs are completely out of sight and it is an attractive tray.

Just a touch of the finger can transform the tray into a table, or vice versa. The table has an attractive mahogany top. Furniture men who have shown it in their stores for test of customer react on say that every woman wants one just as soon as she sees how easily it works.
