

### Few N-Q Drivers Received License

Raleigh — Although one-half of the period has passed in which N through Q drivers may seek renewal of their licenses to drive, only one-fourth have taken their examinations, the North Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles reported today.

The Department estimated that approximately 190,000 drivers in the state whose last names begin with N, O, P or Q will be required to stand examination in the N through Q period in this category have reported for examination.

"Persons in the N through Q category who have not yet taken their renewal tests can be assured of receiving immediate at-

tention if they report to their nearest driver's license examiners now," Department officials stated. "Those who wait till the deadline nears face the prospect of standing in line for their examinations, as drivers in previous examining periods have done when they waited until the rush was on."

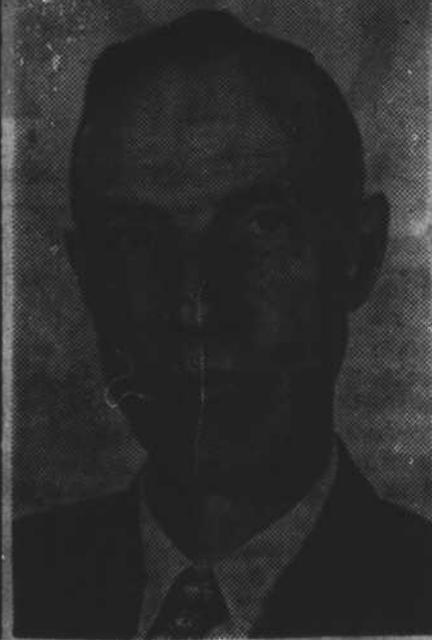

May 10; Raleigh, March 30-May 18, and a course to run successively in Ahoskie, Edenton and Elizabeth City — each city having two meetings — beginning March 31 and running through May 19. The latter will be sponsored with the cooperation of the First Medical District of the North Carolina Medical Society.

Dr. Gilbert Horrax, head of the Department of Neurosurgery of Lahey Clinic, Boston, and consultant to Cushing Veterans Hospital, Framingham, Mass., spoke at North Wilkesboro Tuesday and at Salisbury Wednesday.

All four courses will follow the same routine — a clinic to be held each week at 4 p. m., except in the case of North Wilkesboro when the afternoon session begins at 3. Dinner sessions followed by formal lectures will be held each night of the weekly program at 7 p. m. in Salisbury, Raleigh, and Elizabeth City, Ahoskie and Edenton. They will be at 6:30 in North Wilkesboro and Elkin.

Damage to the warehouse was estimated by firemen at \$1,000 in addition to 25 or 30 bales of waste cotton which was damaged.

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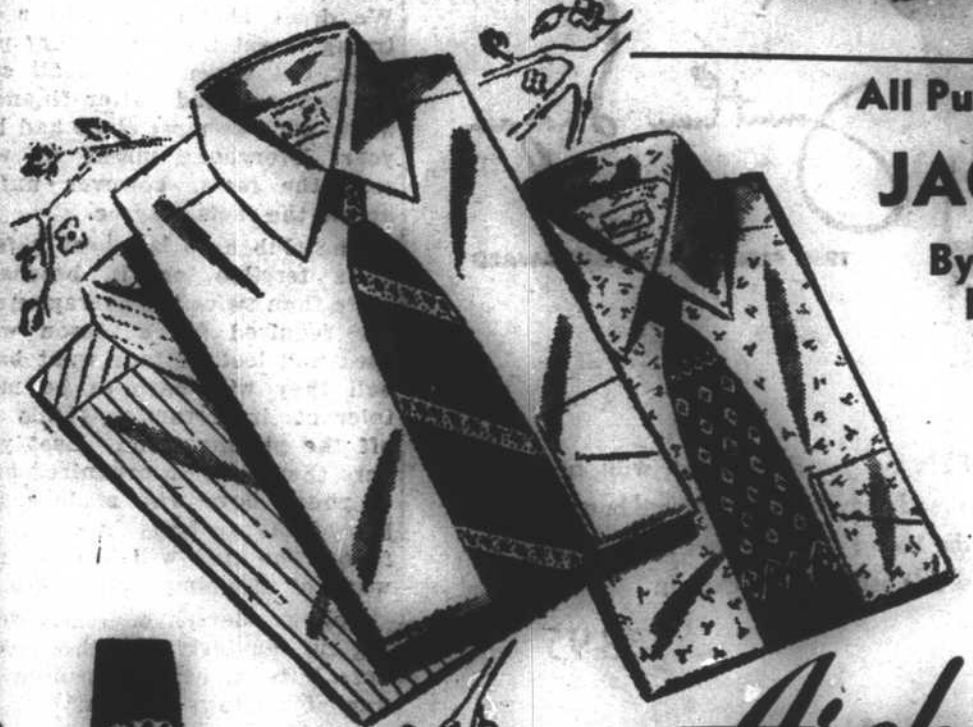
