Women In The Church

Miss Mary Shadow, of Decatur, Tenn., who has the distinction of being both the youngest member and the only woman member of the Tennessee State General Assembly, has been named honorary youth chairman of the \$10,000,000 campaign fund of the Japan International Christian University. Miss Shadow, a former officer of the Methodist Youth Fellowship, is now a teacher in Tennessee Wesleyan College. Her father is a county agricultural agent in the state. The national drive for funds for JICU will be held from April 16 to 23.
