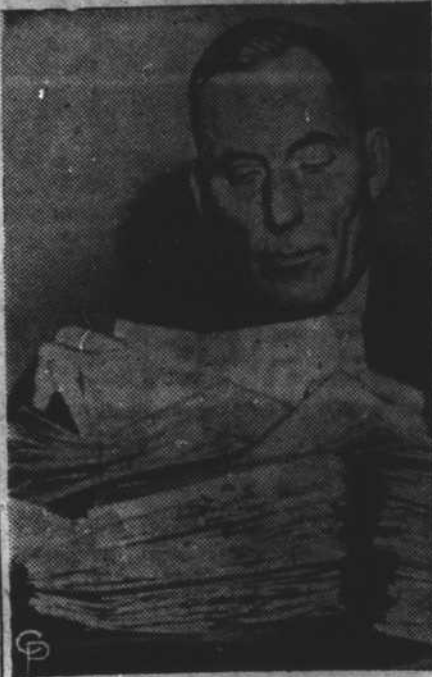

Holdup Try Fails, Man Kills Himself

New York — Frank d'Amato, 25, wrote a short note to his wife.

He was going to try a holdup, he told her, and if he failed he was going to kill himself.

Then he put the note in his pocket and loaded his 38-calibre revolver.

Early today, police said, he pointed it at Salvatore Celentano, took \$10 from him, and drove off in his victim's car.

Celentano grabbed a taxi, alerted a police car, and was on the scene when the patrolman closed in.

As the police ran toward him, d'Amato fired. When they reached him, he was slumped in the car window, dead — a bullet through his right temple.

A few moments later, they found the note in his pocket.

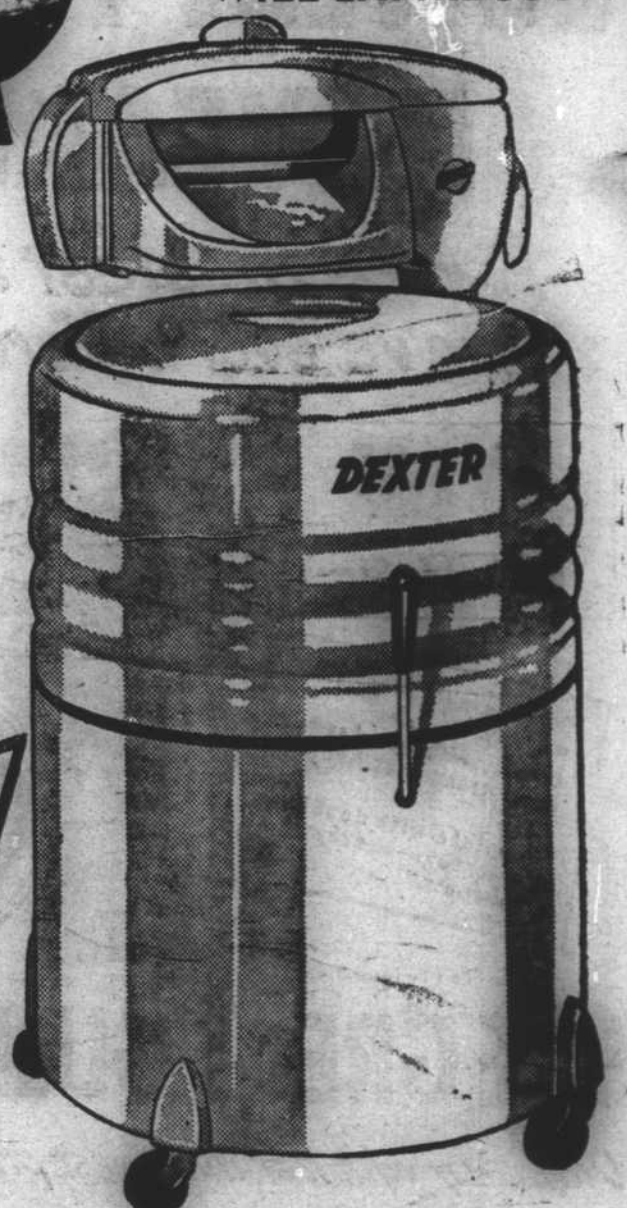
