His purchases were not made in mid-season, but late in September, when Goods were greatly reduced in prices. He therefore thinks they were bought right and will be sold accordingly. He hopes his friends will not take this for granted, but call and see for themselves at the FARMER'S HALL, Nov. 7, 1854.
