The Southern States, not including Delaware, owe as State debts the sum of \$131,000,000. To meet the interest of this debt requires burdensome taxes. If they should set up a separate confederacy, they will require an army, a navy, a postal establishment, courts, &c. This would require at least half the amount it now costs for the entire Union, say, \$40,000,000 a year. As the first step of the confederacy would be to abolish the tariff and open its ports free to commerce, it would have to raise its revenue by direct taxation. This is a most expensive mode of collection, and a large amount of the sum collected, from passing through so many hands, would be lost. But whether the revenue will be raised by direct taxation or by duties on imports, the amount will come entirely out of the pockets of the Southern people. With a large debt and increased taxation, the new Government will find itself crippled in its finances, its people overloaded with taxation, which are certainly not the elements of prosperity in a government, old or new.—Phil Ledger.
