SURVEILLANCE OVER THE NEWSPAPERS. We have obtained a copy of the bill reported by the Military Committee in Congress to establish a surveillance over the newspapers.

A BILL, entitled An Act to prevent information of the plans and operations of the Land and Naval Forces of the Confederate States being conveyed to the Enemy.

SECTION 1. The Congress of the Confederate States do enact, That it shall not be lawful for any person to publish, or cause to be published, in any newspaper or other printed publication...

SECTION 2. It shall not be lawful for any person to write or communicate, for publication, to any newspaper or printed publication, as aforesaid, or the editor or publisher thereof by letter, or otherwise, information, the publication of which is declared unlawful by the first section of this Act.

SECTION 3. Persons offending against the provisions of this act, shall be deemed guilty of a high misdemeanor, and shall be subject to indictment in the District Courts of the Confederate States...
