THE ARMY OF THE POTOMAC. The following is an extract from a private letter from one of the soldiers of the Army of the Potomac. It is dated January 25: "The Army of the Potomac is still maintaining a masterly inactivity, it will not doubt the wisdom of our leaders, nor will I criticize the seeming apathy into which they have fallen, but I must say that inaction is having its legitimate effect upon our troops. Action is the panacea for an army; inaction is its bane. If it keep in motion, the minds of the soldiers are always occupied, and their physical powers brought into play. If it keeps to its encampments, the monotony of routine duties soon wears down the spirits of the soldier; physical exertion is almost wholly suspended, mind and body become relaxed, and disease then steps in to do us tenfold more harm than would a dozen pitched battles."
