LATEST FROM THE NORTH.

The Boston Herald of the 8th has been received. The following is a summary of the news:

FROM THE NORTHWEST.

The steamer Rich was burnt on the night of the 4th at Island No. 1. She was bound for Boston, and had on board eight passengers and 200,000 lbs of goods. The cause of the disaster is not known.

FROM THE SOUTH.

General Sherman's army of 60,000 men has been ordered to march from Savannah to the sea coast. The march is expected to be completed by the end of the month.

FROM CHARLESTON.

General Sherman's army is reported to have captured several thousand muskets in the vicinity of Charleston.

FROM TENNESSEE.
