THEREAS, it has been made appear to me that THOMAS WATSON stands charged by the Coroner's Inquest in the County of Richmond, with the murder of Hugh Brown, and that the said Watson has made his escape :

Now, to the end that the said Thomas Watson may be brought to trial for said offence, I do hereby issue this my proclamation, offering a Reward of \$200 for the apprehension and delivery of the said Thomas

Watson, to the Sheriff of the said County of Richmond, or for his arrest and confinement in any Jail within this State.






