By His Excellency, Charles Manly, Governor of the State of North Carolina.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS the General Assembly did, at their last Session, adopt a Resolution in these

"Resolved, by the General Assembly of the State Wurds, "of North Carolius, that the Governor of the State " for the time being, be directed to set spart a day "in every year, and to give notice thereof, by Pro-" clamation, as a day of solemn and public thanks-" giving to Almighty God, for past blessings, and of * supplication for his continued kindness and care

"over us as a State and as a Nation :" Now, in compliance with the direction therein given, I do hereby set spart THURSDAY, THE FIFTEENTH DAY OF NOVEMBER NEXT, to be observed throughout this State as a day of general Thanksgiving and Praise to Almighty God :--and I do recommend and earnestly desire that all secular employments may be suspended during the day, and that all Ministers of the Gospel, with their congregations, may as:emble in their respective Church's, and unite in rendering gratitude and praise to the Creator and Governor of the earth, for the blessings of Peace; for exemption from the ravages of Pestilence; for the abundant fruts of the earth and for all the other manifold bounties of his Providence, that have crowned the year :-- and to implore of him the continuance of his Fatherly good-Les and Almighty protection over us and the whole resple of the United States; that we may be a people fearing the Lord and walking in his holy ways, and that peace and happiness, truth and justice, re-ligion and piety may be established among us for all egnerations.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State, at the Esecutive De-partment, in the City of Raleigh, this 1st day of October A. D. 1849, and this 74th year of American Independence. CHAS. MANLY.




