IX. Sheriffs, constables and other officers, whose official emoluments are confined to costs and fees, shall be allowed for services performed under the orders of the provost marshal general, the same costs and fees, to be paid in the same manner as is provided by the laws of the local provisional governments for like service 'under those laws.

X. All persons in this military district, who may know of any threatened breach of the peace, or of the commission of any crime or offence, are requested to make complaint thereof at once to the chief of police or marshal of the city or town: or, if the crime or disorder shall be committed without the limits of any city or town, to a mag istrate or the sheriff of the county or district, and if prompt action shall not be taken by the officer to whom the matter shall be reported, such persons are requested to report all the facts to the post commander and to the provost marshal general prescribed by the several acts of Congress for dis-
