7. Whilst troops are waiting payment, supplies will be furnished by the respective Supply Departments, on the usual regulations and returns, as prescribed by the Chief Muster Officer or his Assistant.

8. Until after payment, and the final discharge of the troops, the Chief Muster Officer will look to their being kept together and under discipline.

9. The Chief Muster Officer will, under regulations to be established by himself, take possession of and carefully preserve, the regiments' and company records, and the colors with the respective regiments, and had them subject to the orders from the Adjutant General's office.

10. As soon as practicable, after arrival at the State Rendezvous, the Chief Muster Officer or his Assistant, will receive the arms and other property belonging to the State by the troops, are turned over to the proper officer of the Supply Department thereat.

11. In preparing the muster out rolls, Corps, Department, Division and Brigade commanders will be required to make a correct record of the enlisted men, and the better to establish the claims of the non-commissioned officers and privates who have been wounded, or of the representatives of those who have died from disease, wounds, or been killed in action.

12. Prior to the departure of regiments from the rendezvous where mustered out, all public property (except arms, colors and equipment) will be inventoried, and turned over to, and cared for by, the proper officers of the Supply Department concerned.

13. Where prescribed in the foregoing for a regiment, will be applicable to a battery of artillery, or an independent company.

14. The respective State Rendezvous, the following is ordered, viz: The Paymaster General will be prepared to have a mustered force of Paymasters, to insure prompt payments.

15. The Quartermaster General and Commissary General of Subsistence, will be prepared to have a suitable number of officers and privates, respectively, to provide supplies, transportation, and receipts for public property.
