NAVY DEPARTMENT, BUREAU OF CONSTRUCTION, No. 1, White Pine, 1 inch boards, per M feet, board measure.

**SEALED PROPOSALS.**—Sealed proposals for "Timber or Lumber," as the case may be, (naming the Navy Yard and class for which the timber is intended), will be received by the Bureau of Construction, Navy Department, at the Navy Yard, until the first of August, 1852, at the discretion of the Secretary of the Navy. The proposals must be made in duplicate, and must be accompanied by a cash bond, equal to the value of the timber proposed, and must be made in the form and on the conditions prescribed in the instructions attached to the proposals.

When the proposals are opened, the contractor who offers the lowest price, and whose timber is deemed by the Secretary of the Navy to be the best, will be selected to execute the contract. The contractor must deliver the timber at the Navy Yard, and must be ready to commence work at the expiration of the contract.
