Once more in a land of liberty, we breathe freely, again, and desire to be thankful for the blessing. Having been detained over a fortnight in Milan, we have been taught, under Austrian military instruction, a practical lesson on its value, which can be so well learned in no other school.

We reached this fine hotel last evening, and proposed to remain a few days to realize the pleasure of our escape from the worst tyranny that exists among civilized nations.

Other large palaces have been similarly treated, the occupants driven out, and the furniture turned into the streets.
