**NORTHERN MAIL**—(By RAILROAD)

Through Mail closes daily — at 6 a. m.

Way Mail — — — — — at 6 p. m.

Arrives daily — — — — — at 6 p. m.

The Can leaves the depot — — — — — at 8 a. m.

**SOUTHERN MAIL**—(By TWO-HORSE HACK)

Closes daily — — — — — at 6 p. m.

Arrives daily — — — — — at 6 p. m.

The Hack leaves — — — — — at 7 a. m.

**WESTERN MAIL**—(By FOUR-HORSE COACH)

Closes daily — — — — — at 7 a. m.

Arrives daily — — — — — at 11 p. m.

The Coach leaves — — — — — at 8 a. m.

**GOLDSBORO' MAIL**—(By FOUR-HORSE COACH)

Closes daily, except Sunday — — — — — at 7 a. m.

Arrives daily (except Monday) — — — — — at 1 a. m.

The Coach leaves — — — — — at 7 a. m.

**TARBORO' MAIL**—(By Two-horse Hack)

Closes on Sunday, Tues. and Thur. at 6 p. m.

Arrives Tuesday, Thurs. and Sat. at 7 p. m.

Hack leaves on Mon. Wed. and Fri. at 5 a. m.

**PITTSBORO' MAIL**—(By Three-horse Hack)

Closes on Tuesday and Saturday at 6 p. m.

Arrives on Monday and Thursday at 7 p. m.

Hack leaves on Sun. and Wed. about 7 a. m.

**ROXBORO' MAIL**—(By Horse, Weekly)

Closes every Friday — — — — — at 12 m.

Arrives every Friday — — — — — at 10 a. m.

**DRUGS.**—(By Railroads)

Arrives at the earliest possible time after the arrival of the Northern mail, which will generally be in about an hour.
