THE SALUBRITY CONVENTION.—We publish in this issue, the proceedings of the Convention that assembled at Salisbury, on the 2d instant, to take into consideration the railroad system of the State and to devise some plan to be recommended to the next Legislature for pushing forward our works of internal improvement in progress or in contemplation. We commend the resolutions to the careful consideration of all well wishers of the Old North State. They contemplate, as it will be seen, the subscription on the part of the State of two-thirds of the capital stock of all such roads as may be deemed necessary for the development of the resources and the promotion of the interests of the State, when one third shall have been subscribed by individuals. Prominent among the routes recommended for railroads is the extension of the Central Road, East and West, which is now looked upon by our people as a first fact. Besides these, two other important plans contemplating a connection with the West were adopted, which if carried out, might lead to beneficial results to the interests of the State.

Our State has now fairly embarked in works of internal improvement, that has become her settled policy, as regarded by all parties, and thus vindicating the propriety and justice of her advocacy by many wise and patriotic men, who in the days when appropriations for such objects were extremely unpopular, manfully battled for the right and maintained the correct policy at the risk of sacrificing themselves at home. The completion of all works that may be necessary to the development of the varied resources of our beloved State and to fostering the numerous interests that require encouragement, is now only a question of time.

The action of the next Legislature will have a very important bearing upon the future well being of the State, and its acts may determine for years to come whether we will compete with our sister States in enterprise and energy, or whether we will fall back and quit the race. We have strong hopes that something will be done that will not disappoint the expectations of the well wishers of the Old North State.

MEXICO.—An Inquest was held by Coroner Scott over the body of a free negro named Charles, who was found murdered on the Fayetteville road, several miles from this city, on Friday morning last. His death was caused by a frightful wound extending from the groin upwards towards the loins, which was doubtless made by a knife. The testimony before the coroner's jury, we learn, implicates a free negro named Jordan, and a free woman in the heinous deed. The woman has been lodged in jail, but the man has not been taken.

FATAL ACCIDENT.—A most frightful accident, resulting in the sudden and violent death of a most estimable old lady of this county, occurred in this city on Saturday morning last. As Mr. William Bird was coming into the city accompanied by his wife, the horses attached to his carriage took flight just below the residence of Mrs. Bird, ran away and upset the carriage, throwing Mrs. Bird out upon the rocks in the street, with such force as to cause her death in a very short time. She was, we understand, quite an aged lady.

CELESTIAL PALACE CHIMNEY.—That grand monument, that not even the powerful genius of Baromet would galvanize into life, has, at last, expired.—The New York Crystal Palace was closed as a place of exhibition on the last day of October. Yankee enterprise, in the building time, signally failed that time. It was no insignificant scheme to come under the rule that would govern the saddlers of wooden shoes, wooden nutmegs, &c. It required something yet more substantial than the light and flimsy substance that sells most cheaply. Nay, its failure has but typical of the downfall of that less magnificent system of building that, in all classes and professions, has taken hold of a large part of the American people. May it be said that the age of humbug is dead.

THE FORT NEWS.—It will be seen by the last arrival, the news from the seat of war, as given in another column, indicates that the allies had opened a terrible bombardment upon Sebastopol, and it is even again rumored that that important place had fallen. The powers, at least, do not expend their energies upon small affairs, in skirmishes, pretended attacks, &c., but set themselves to work to plant their batteries and dispose their forces, so that, what they did, when they once commenced, might be effectually done. Though the defense is very desperate, Sebastopol has in all probability fallen, and the allies gained important footing in the Crimea.—We suppose they have done all this, will that bring them much nearer to the subjugation of Russia? True, it is one step, and a very decided one, but still Russia hold out, it will require every soldier's march, and many a hard battle to overcome her in her belated strength. We shall see.

A NATIONAL CONVENTION IN WASHINGTON CITY.—The defenders of the country in the second year of independence, who still survive, and the children of such as are dead, are notified by the President, that he has appointed a National Convention, in January last, to send delegates to the city of Washington, to attend a convention, to be held there on the 8th of January next, 1855, to adopt such measures as will induce Congress not only to do justice to them, but also to the widows of those who have gone as they have served.

REPORT. The general Session Committee have performed the duty assigned them in the best manner, and have directed to be published the following resolutions: Your Committee, in the first place, deemed it expedient to recommend to the Convention the adoption of some general principle which should guide the Legislature in lending aid to Railroads, or other works of Internal Improvement. And your Committee, upon the suggestion of the Honorable gentleman from New Hanover, agreed upon the following resolution with great unanimity.
