From the collection of Mr. Wise's sentences, and the sequence aimed at in the manner of stating his proposition, he would have his readers to believe that the naturalization provided for by the Constitution of the United States was by way of denial, and in defiance of this claim, the authority of the British government; and that the naturalization of foreigners was a new and a great principle, then for the first time sprung upon the world, as a sort of legal proclamation by a land of liberty, against the disposition of Europe...

Because, if the citizens of one State were to be citizens of another, a citizen in every other State, then, of course, the rule by which a foreigner is made a citizen should be the same throughout all the States. And the Congress alone was the only power having jurisdiction broad enough to make and apply the rule. Mr. Wise might as well say that the authority conferred on Congress by the very same clause containing this "fourth power," to establish a uniform rule "on the subject of bankruptcies, throughout the United States," was intended for the purpose of "supplanting the dogma of tyrants."
