200 DOLLARS REWARD.
A Proclamation by His Excellency, WILLIAM A. GRAHAM, Governor of North Carolina.

WHEREAS, It has been made known to me by WILLIAM FORBES, Coroner of Caswell County, that one EDWIN SAWYER, late of the County of Pasquotank, stands charged with the murder of Catherine Linton, a white woman, in the said County of Caswell, and that the said Edwin Sawyer has escaped from Justice.

Now, therefore, I, WILLIAM A. GRAHAM, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do issue this my Proclamation, offering a reward of TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS, for the apprehension and delivery of the said Edwin Sawyer to the Sheriff of Caswell county aforesaid, or for his commitment to any Jail in the United States, beyond the limits of the said State, Civil and Military, to use their best exertions to arrest the fugitive aforesaid, that he may be dealt with according to Law.

Given under my hand, and attested with the Great Seal of the State of North Carolina, at the City of Raleigh, the 11th day of December, A. D. 1845, and of our Independence the 70th.
