A PROFITABLE STATE INVESTMENT.—The debt of Illinois has been reduced to \$800,000, and will be extinguished, it is claimed, within a year by the payment to the State of the dues of the Illinois Central railroad. This railroad has proved a bonanza to the State.

When the bill for the creation of this road was before the Illinois Legislature Senator Douglas affixed a provision by which instead of paying taxes it should pay in lieu thereof seven per cent. of its gross receipts every year. The sum received by the State from the railroad has been yearly increasing and has gradually wiped out the State debt. When this is gone, as it will be within a year, it is thought that the road will yield a sufficient revenue to carry on the ordinary expenses of the government, thus doing away with the necessity for carrying any State taxes.
